## **Comptroller Hegar Extols Law Enforcement Grants During Eldorado Visit**

#### Says Supporting Rural Law Enforcement is Good for Texas

Texas Comptroller Glenn Wednesday, October 2nd, where he met with Schleicher County Judge Charlie Bradley, Sheriff Jason Chatham and Treasurer Jennifer Henderson as part of his Good For Texas Tour series. He was in town to call attention to law enforcement and prosecutor office grants his office administers totaling more than \$125 million. The grants were authorized in 2023 by the 88th Texas Legislature as part of Sen-

ate Bill 22. The Schleicher County Sheriff's Office has thus far received

iff's Office has thus far received \$25,000 in grant funds under SB 22. An additional \$275,000 went to the S1st District Attorney's office for a total of \$255,000 in financial support. Hegar said the money pro-vided supplemental salary assis-tance to help ensure professional law enforcement and legal repre-sentation of the people's interests throughout the state.
